### 3. HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

#### **3.1 EMERGENCY OVERVIEW**

**Immediate Health, Physical and Environmental Hazards:** Containers exposed to high heat from fire or other sources may build pressure and explode.

# 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

# 7.HANDLING AND STORAGE

#### 7.1 HANDLING

Do not eat, drink or smoke when using this product. Wash exposed areas thoroughly with soap and water. Keep away from heat, sparks, open flame, pilot lights and other sources of ignition. Avoid breathing of vapors, mists or spray. Avoid eye contact with vapors, mists, or spray. Keep out of reach of children. Prevent build-up of vapors. Open windows and doors. Use only with ventilation. Do not ignite matches, lighter, etc. Use general ventilation and/or local ventilation. If ventilation is not adequate, use respiratory protective equipment.

#### 7.2 STORAGE
